



### Pinot Noir Rosé 2011

Domain Road Vineyard is tucked away in the village of Bannockburn, near Cromwell, Central Otago, an area famous for its 19th century gold fields. A unique micro-climate of hot summers and snowy winters provides perfect conditions for growing diverse grape varieties.

The Pinot Noir vines have been planted to take advantage of the shelter provided by the surrounding hills. This gives the grapes a complex mix of flavours that create a superbly flavoursome wine.

### The Wine

Made from 100-per cent Pinor Noir grapes, the fruit was harvested in April 2011 and whole bunch pressed. Fermentation was stopped while a touch of residual sugar remained in order to balance the wine's natural acidity.

With a lifted nose of strawberries and crème brûlée, this wine is soft and creamy on the palate with flavours of berry and caramel. A balanced acidity complements a crisp, long lingering finish.
